NEW YORK TIMES FIRST DANCE

On the first night of December, an unseasonably cold one in the Ozarks, the boys and girls of John Brown University primped in their zoot suits, suspenders, waisrecats, spars, face-hawks, pompadours, knee-length pleated skiets, nylons, moods and inch-high black heels and marched through snow drifts to their gymnasium in the Walson Lifetime Health Complex, one of northwest Arkansa's momuments to the Wal-Mart family's generosity. Inside, the gymnasium was decorated with rows of Christmas lights strang overhead across the width of the basketball court, from one railing of the mezzanine jogging track to the other. The occasion, which would last from 8 p.m. to 11 p.m., was a dance, the first of its kind at this small, nondemonimational Christian college.

As if to make up for 90 essentially dance-free years on campus, the 14-pice Jack Mitchell Big Band began playing early, shortly before S, and from the first mote of "In the Mood" the best dancers clustered up four, where they performed aerial lifts, between-the-leg diffest and precarious dips, looking life a reasonably good audition for "So You Think You Can Dance" or the great "khakis swing" Gap ad from 1998. These joyful, look-limbed performances concealed a rather startling truth. The young men and women of this 1,200-person college were dancing alonguide, and in some cases bumping soaked into, their persident, dcan and chaplain — the men who only six months ago could have expelled them for doing so. From the school's founding in 1919 by John Brown Sc. — not the abolizionito tu a Subration Army intereast turned preacher — will last Occober, dancing had been seen at J.B.U, as a gateware to sin. Students danced, but in private.

The school's "community covenant" had prohibited, in addition to smoking, sex outside of marriage, drinking and gambling, all on-campus dancing except "folk or square dancing and choreography as part of a dramatic production." 






Value of College Degree
