
#### What is the Concurrent Program?

- Opportunity to offer dual credit in private Christian high schools across the United States through qualified high school teachers who are partnered with JBU faculty
  - JBU currently has 14 partner schools involved in the 2019-2020 partnership school year
  - Our 14 partner schools are located in 4 states: Arkansas, Kansas, Texas, and Virginia
- Unique program allowing schools to maintain faithbased curriculum while offering college credit courses

#### Student Eligibility Requirements

20 ACT | 1020 SAT (CR + M) | 66 CLT 3.0 GPA

Juniors can qualify with: 429 Aspire | 20 PreACT | 1020 PSAT | 66 CLT10

#### Concurrent Instructor Minimum Requirements

- A Master's degree or higher in the discipline being taught, or...
- A Master's degree or higher in any discipline, along with 18 graduate hours in the discipline being taught
  - Degrees must be awarded from regionally accredited institutions at the time the degree was earned

#### **Additional Helpful Criteria**

- Evidence of positive teaching evaluations and lead administrator recommendation
- Commitment to Christian higher education and a passion for teaching and spiritual formation within the evangelical tradition is required
- Prior experience teaching an advanced course in the subject area (concurrent, AP, or honors equivalent) is preferred
- At least five years of teaching experience in the subject area is preferred

### **Concurrent Program Tuition**

- \$105 per credit hour
- Students are limited to three courses per semester and a total of 24 hours in the program
- High schools collect the tuition from families and pay one collective tuition bill from JBU

#### **Concurrent Scholarship**

For the high school graduates who participated in the concurrent program, JBU is committed to return the student's investment as a scholarship for up to \$1,260

\$1,260 = 12 concurrent credit hours

#### Other Course Modalities

#### Online

Entirely asynchronous, allowing flexibility for the high school in scheduling

#### **Enhanced Face-to-Face**

- Asynchronous OR synchronous. Lectures are streamed live from the JBU main campus, and also recorded, so students/schools have options.
- Piloting CS 1113 Introduction to Computing (Fall 2019)

#### How can your school join?

- Complete the partnership application (brief two page document)
- The application requires an agreement to JBU's statement of faith and signatures from your school leaders

#### What is the next step?

Once approved, partner schools will:

- Pre-register the courses they wish to offer the next school year
- Submit teaching applications for potential concurrent instructors
- Advertise to their families and help students apply online
- Attend the Concurrent Teacher Summit
