

Q1 Which degree did you, or will you receive from JBU to get your teaching license?





Q2 Graduation Date - What semester did you, or will you graduate?









Q5 What is your teaching area?





Q6 Are you currently teaching in your original licensure area(s)?





Q7 Which best describes the school where you are teaching?





Q8 Which best describes the private school where you work?











Q13 Component 1e. Designing Coherent Instruction: Learning activities; Instructional materials and resources; Instructional groups; and Lesson and unit structure





Q14 Component 1f: Designing Student Assessments: Congruence with instructional outcomes; Criteria and standards; Design of formative assessments; and Use for planning





Q15 Component 2a: Creating an Environment of Respect and Rapport: Teacher interaction with students; and Student interaction with other students





Q16 Component 2b: Establishing a Culture for Learning: Importance of the content; Expectations for learning and achievement; and Pride in student work.





Q17 Component 2c. Managing Classroom Procedures: Management of instructional groups; Management of transitions; Management of materials





Q18 Component 2d. Managing Student Behavior: Expectations; Monitoring of student behavior; and Response to student behavior





Q19 Component 2e. Organizing Physical Space: Safety and accessibility; and Arrangement of furniture and use of physical resources





Q20 Component 3a. Communicating with Students: Expectations for learning; Directions and procedures; Explanations of content; and Use of oral and written language





Q21 Component 3b. Using Questioning and Discussion Techniques: Quality of questions; Discussion techniques; and Student participation









Q24 Component 3e: Demonstrating Flexibility and Responsiveness: Lesson adjustment; Response to students; and Persistence





Q25 Component 4a: Reflecting on Teaching: Accuracy; and Use in future teaching





Q26 Component 4b: Maintaining Accurate Records: Student completion of assignments; Student progress in learning; and Non-instructional records





Q27 Component 4c: Communicating with Families: Information about the instructional program; Information about individual students; and Engagement of families in the instructional program






